65. Michael Normoyle, 17, first offence, committed 4 January 1848, stealing a piece of timber the property of the Waterford-Limerick Railway Company, tried at the Easter Sessions 1848, guilty, 6 months from 20 April, discharged 6 October 1848.

On Thursday morning Michael Normoyle broke a pane glass in the shop of Mr. Evans in William-street, and deliberately stole a valuable pistol. The fellow was apprehended and lodged in the gaol. He said he committed the act with the view of being transported.

66. Michael Normoyle, 18, second offence, committed 7 December 1848, breaking glass and stealing a pistol the property of Mr Evans, tried January Sessions 1849, guilty, to be transported for 7 years, sent to Dublin on 20 July.
